French Language Indentification Tools

For Residents



"Je parle français" Name Tag Stickers

These stickers are a perfect way to identify Francophone residents. They are also a great way to identify the owner of certain items like canes, wheel chairs, walkers, or even books, eyeglass cases, etc.



"Je parle français" Stickers

These stickers are used on Francophone residents' doors or Francophone staff's desks, doors or name plates to identify them. This benefits both staff and residents to receive and give culturally appropriate care.
